Larimer County 4-H In-Person Programming Policy

- All Larimer County 4-H programming should continue virtually unless explicit approval has been
 granted through the process outlined below by the Larimer County Extension Office to hold the
 programming in-person. This status will be maintained until it is officially communicated based on
 Colorado State and Larimer County Health Department guidelines that normal, in-person 4-H
 programming may resume.
- An approved 4-H volunteer may request to hold in-person 4-H programming through the following process:
 - Submit the Larimer 4-H Event Plan Application for Essential In-Person Programming form found online here at least 2 weeks before your event:
 - The form will be reviewed by the Larimer County Extension 4-H Agent(s). If the request is approved, it will be forwarded on to the Colorado State 4-H Office, the Regional Office and the CSU Extension and Engagement State Office for review.
 - Written Approval or Rejection will then be communicated back to the volunteer requesting to hold the event.
- Reasons to conduct in-person programming
 - Programming cannot be done safely remotely or virtually
 - For reasons of lack of internet access or stability among core participants
 - Achieve Positive Youth Development outcomes which cannot be achieved virtually
 - The use of tools, equipment or facility to achieve the goals of the programming require in-person programming
- If in-person programming is approved:
 - Health and Safety guidelines agreed to in the application must be explicitly followed before, during, and following the event.
 - A complete list of youth and adult attendees must be submitted to the Larimer County Extension Office within 2 days (48 hours) of the completion of the event.
 - Signage provided must be posted for the duration of the event.
 - Any incidents that occur at the event that may compromise the health and safety of the attendees should be reported to the 4-H Extension Agent.
- In-Person programming approval may be revoked at any time for the following reasons:
 - Violation of the agreed to Health and Safety Guidelines are observed
 - Changes to the COVID guidelines from the Larimer County Health Department or Colorado State Department of Public Health and Environment
- Consequences for violating any part of this policy may include, but are not limited to: removal
 from participation in the event in which the policy has been violated (at the individual's expense);
 sanctions on participating in future 4-H events; forfeiture of financial support for the event;
 removal from offices held, etc. Behavior outside of 4-H activities can affect "member in good
 standing" or "volunteer in good standing" status.
- Larimer County Health Department and Colorado State Department of Public Health and Environment guidelines supersede Larimer County Extensions Office in-person programming approvals if they are updated to become more stringent and the approved in-person programming is no longer considered safe within those guidelines.
